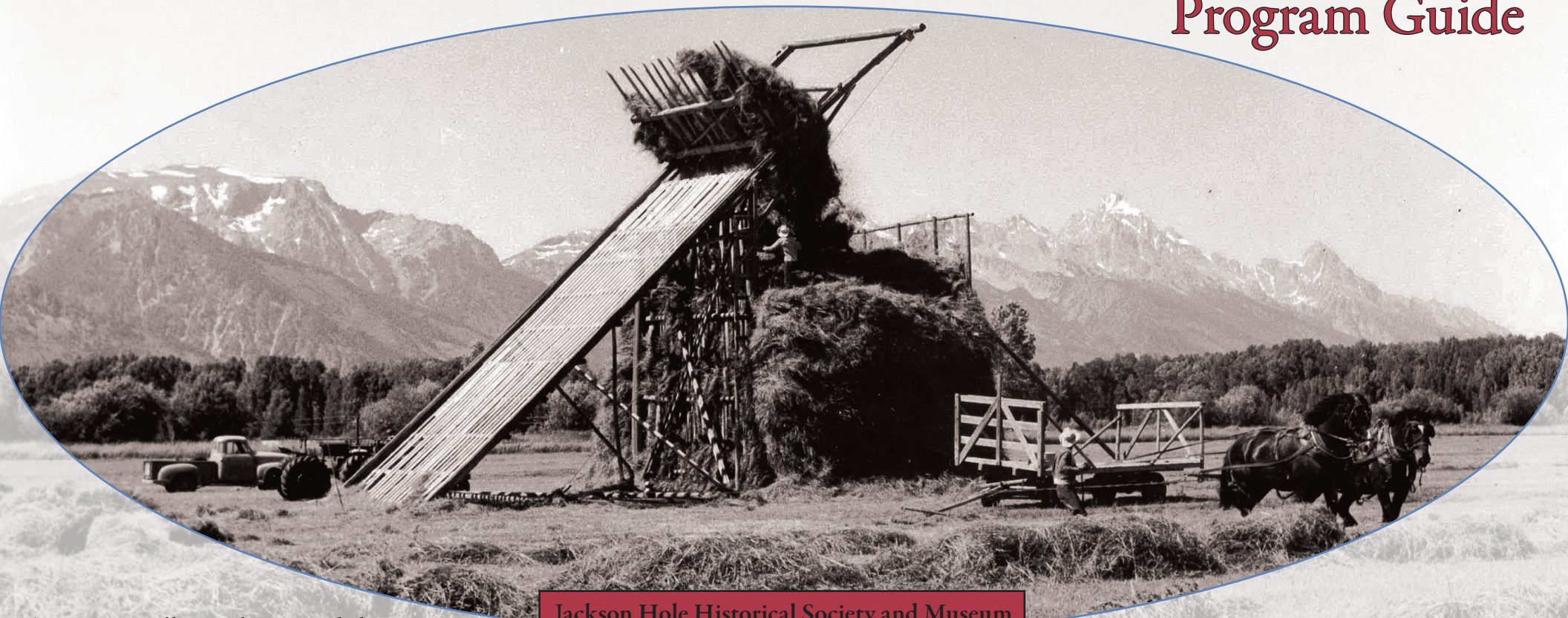
One of the oldest non-profit organizations in Teton County, Wyoming, the history museum first opened its doors in 1958. Founders W. C. "Slim" Lawrence's passion was to collect Jackson Hole history, and his friend, Homer Richards, provided the first museum building. The North Cache museum opened in 2011.

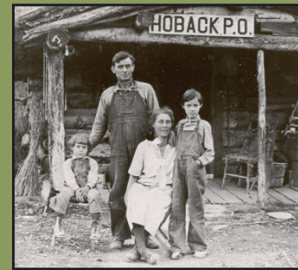
